Nith Valley Camp Sponsorship Fund:

The Christian Formation Ministry Team along with the Sunday School Team are committed to supporting faith formation beyond our Sunday morning Sunday School hour. We believe a camp experience is unique as it allows children and youth an opportunity to explore God's creation in new ways.

Practicing Erratic Discipleship

Sometimes it is hard to put experiences into words. I hope this short reflection about our Missional community will give you a glimpse into what we have been up to.

For the past 4 months we have experimented in how to be and grow a missional community. We have met 3 out of 4 Mondays each month. We have grown from 3 to 7 households. When we are altogether we are 28 individuals, but as life goes we usually average between 23-25 around the dinner table.

We have worked at finding a rhythm of spending time together, spending time with God and spending time in the community we live in. In Re-Learning Community terms we refer to it as IN - UP - OUT.

Each Monday evening we begin our meal and during it we pass the thanksgiving spoon sharing with each other what we are thankful for.

After some time of fellowship we focus on either IN -UP - OUT activities.

Before Christmas our time UP was spent wondering what each nativity character might have experienced during this mysterious night 2000 years ago.

The wisdom shared by young and old was truly sacred.

Our OUT time was spent at the local Tim Hortons coffee shop modeling kindness and generosity. All of us took turns to pay it forward by paying for a customer in the drive through or at the counter. For a moment we knew we were passing on the Spirit of Christmas.

During our time we have had opportunity to get to know others around the table whom we usually would not have spent much time with. Early in January we more intentionally spent some IN time finding out what kind of work everyone in the group is doing. It was fascinating to hear what jobs small and big occupies a person's day.

In the coming months we look forward to practicing our IN - UP -OUT and as we look into 2018 our hope and prayer is that we will birth another MC which meets at a different time and with different people.

It is our hope to continue to be disciples who walk in the footsteps of God Emmanuel.
